





The Creative Photography Process


- 1. Observe in cropped-down view
- 2. Look carefully at the detail
- 3. Know what kinds of things make good subjects
- 4. Decide what you want to photograph
- 5. Consider possibilities for improvement
- 6. Compose using techniques of good composition
- 7. Take the shot
- 8. Evaluate your image, improve it, and redo if needed

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
Humans see in wide angle

- About 200-degree wide FOV
- Too broad a view, too much info
- Tends to keep us from seeing the possibilities











1. Observe in a cropped down view

2. Look carefully at the detail


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Study the subject area closely

- Very young things


